Memorial Guidelines of the Flossenbürg Concentration Camp Memorial

The Memorial contains cemeteries where over 20,000 people who died at the Flossenbürg Concentration Camp and on the death marches are buried. Visitors are asked to respect the dignity of the site and wear appropriate attire.

Children under 12 years of age may visit the Memorial only in the accompaniment of an adult.

The memorial reserves the right to refuse admission to visitors wearing clothing bearing racist or offensive slogans or symbols.

Visitors are asked to observe the following additional guidelines:

- 1. Baby carriages and wheelchairs are permitted on the paths; no other forms of conveyance are permitted.
- 2. Please remain on the marked paths when touring the grounds.
- 3. Animals other than guide dogs for the blind are not permitted.
- 4. Carrying out trade or advertising and distributing printed matter or other materials is prohibited.
- 5. Photographs and filming for commercial use is prohibited without expressed permission.
- 6. The recording of guided tours led by staff and representatives of the foundation, in whole or in part, in sound or printed form, in the print media or on the internet (social media, etc.), requires the prior consent of the respective employees and the foundation's representatives.
- 7. Meetings, assemblies and events may be held on the grounds only with expressed permission.
- 8. The Flossenbürg Concentration Camp Memorial reserves the right to make use of its property rights to deny access to persons who belong to parties or organizations that have appeared to have committed or committed antidemocratic, racist, or other expressions contrary to the purpose of the foundation, or to exclude them from attending an event.
- 9. Please do not consume food in the exhibits.
